Persidangan Antarabangsa Malaysia-Indonesia pertama kali diadakan di Fakulti Sastera dan Sains Sosial Universiti Malaya pada 17-20 Julai 2007. Enam tahun telah berlalu dan sebanyak enam persidangan telah dilangsungkan secara bergilir-gilir antara Universiti Malaya dengan salah sebuah universiti di Indonesia. Tiga universiti di Indonesia yang telah menyambut giliran ialah Universitas Gadjah Mada (2008), Universitas Andalas (2010), dan Universitas Airlangga (2012).

Persidangan kali ketujuh ini seperti sebelumnya akan terus membincangkan isu-isu penting dalam bidang yang berkaitan dengan hubungan Malaysia-Indonesia dalam konteks sejarah, politik, ekonomi, geografi, media dan bidang-bidang kemanusiaan serta sains sosial yang lain. Dengan tema *Memperkasa Ketahanan, Memperkaya Perkongsian*, persidangan kali ini melibatkan pembentangan sebanyak 124 kertas kerja oleh staf akademik dan pelajar pascasiswazah. Sebanyak 66 kertas kerja akan dibentangkan oleh pensyarah dan 58 oleh pelajar. Daripada bilangan tersebut, 64 kertas kerja mewakili Malaysia dan 60 kertas kerja mewakili Indonesia.

Persidangan ini ternyata merupakan suatu wadah yang sangat penting untuk menjalin kerjasama antara universiti di kedua-dua negara. Bukan sahaja pensyarah dan pelajar pascasiswazah dapat membincangkan penyelidikan-penyeleidikan terkini mereka malah hasil daripada perkenalan dan rangkaian yang lebih baik, kegiatan seperti pertukaran pelajar dan pensyarah, penerbitan bersama dan penyelidikan bersama dapat dirancang dan dilaksanakan. Untuk beberapa tahun kebelakangan ini, bilangan pelajar ijazah pertama dan ijazah lanjutan yang terlibat dalam program pertukaran pelajar semakin bertambah. Begitu juga bilangan universiti di Indonesia yang terlibat dalam kerjasama ini semakin meningkat.

EVALUATION of IMPLEMENTATION MODEL FOR COOPERATION BETWEEN YOGYAKARTA STATE UNIVERSITY INDONESIA AND UNIVERSITY OF MALAYA MALAYSIA

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In this study aims to evaluate implementation model of cooperation between Yogyakarta State University and Malaya University. The methods in study was used mix methods. Subjects were students on student exchange programs and staff. Data collected by the documentation, questionnaires and interviews. Subsequently analyzed descriptive according to the rules in force. Consistent with the fact that the pilot cooperation in the field was started in 2009 as outlined in the MoU. The various types of cooperative activity in collaboratively as an exchange student, staff and lectures, joint research, and publication. But until now there has not been an evaluation study of the activity Model. The result showed that: in the student exchange program has been implemented by 2 times visits both of YSU and UM. From the last 10 students gained as much as 100 % This program needs to be continued with a duration of at least 1-6 months and transfer credit. So, exchange staff have also been carried out 1 times with the aim to complement and enhance the quality work and the system in each of the institution, while the exchange of lecturers have also been implemented with the goal of optimizing the potential of human resources and collaborate for teaching, research and publications . While the things contained in the MoU and yet carried out with the maximum is to conduct collaborative research and publication to the ISI international journal together. Conclusion. The cooperation between the two university gives a very positive benefits for both parties, so it needs to be continued and optimized in accordance with the MoU.


Overview of the University of Malaya



This study is a mixed methods. This study aimed to evaluate the implementation of the cooperation between YSU with University Malaya. In this study population used is YSU and UM academic community. The subjects used were student exchange program, and staff YSU and UM. In this research, data collection techniques used include the study documentation, questioner, and interviews. data analysis was conducted using qualitative and quantitative descriptive with the following rules apply.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Based on a review of documentation and interviews with sources (Sugirin, 2009) obtained information that a pilot collaboration between YSU and UM initiated in 2009 with the understanding between the director of Sport Centre and Sport Science Faculty Dean to continue to university level. Before executed a Memorandum of Understanding / MoU parties

also invite resource persons for YSU International Seminar of UM sports center. With the agreement that has been built, further followed by the ICR of each university for the signing of the MoU. This important event conducted at University Malaya on January 11, 2010 between the Rector of the Yogyakarta State University and University Malaya. Based on the documentation after the signing of the MoU has implemented several activities carried out as follows:

Besides the above data were also obtained data from a questioner who filled out by students participating in student exchange related to the implementation of the program . The questioner is intended to evaluate the implementation and provide feedback on the implementation of the student exchange program . Questioner is divided into two kinds of the first with a Likert scale to assess the stage of the preparation , implementation and evaluation stages of the end of each program , while the second form of open-ended questions consisted of four questions regarding : 1). whether the student exchange should be carried out periodically ? 2). what benefits gained by exchange student ? 3). ideal model for the implementation of student exchange ? and 4). comments on implementation of student exchange .

Students as subjects in this study were the following students from YSU in 2013 some 10 people . From the results obtained data collection answers the questioner was distributed as follows : at the pre activity before departure to UM concerning passport issues , information and briefing materials will be conducted in university purposes . and the provision of technical and non-technical obtained partial results in percentages : 30.9 % very good , either 49.1 . 16.4 % and 3.6 % good enough is not good . In the implementation phase of student exchange program that includes aspects of service , facilities , material content , field trips and student satisfaction pertahapan obtained partial results in percentages : 44.8 % very good, either 49.7 . 5.6 % and 0 % good enough less well . In the final stage of evaluation or student exchange program which contains an evaluation of each material , a written evaluation / questionnaire and report activities result obtained 42.4 % excellent , 36.4 % good , 18.2 % fairly well , 3.0 % less good and 0 % very poor .

These results were partially pertahapan results , while the overall results obtained percentages as follows : the pre- activity of 23.8 % with the details (7.4 % excellent , 11.7 % good , 3.9 % is quite good and 0 . 9 % unfavorable) and 61.9 % with the implementation phase of the details of the results (27.7 % excellent , 30.7 % good , 3.5 % is quite good) as well as the final stage of the details obtained 14.3 % 6.1 % very good , good 5.2 % , 2.6 % and 0.4 % good enough is not good .

DISCUSSION

The first related to enforceability of the program , from the above results have shown the continuity / sustainability of the program over the years simultaneously . This is possible due to the establishment of feasibility intensive communication . Judging from the frequency of the activity after the MoU was signed between UM YSU and subsequently rolled out a variety of activities including student exchange , staff exchange , lecturer exchange , joint research , invite speakers for international conferences and publications .

Of a student exchange program that has been implemented viewed from long execution time is in the range 1 week to 4 weeks , so if it will be used contextually or

equivalent courses for conversion and transfer credits do not meet enough of hours of teaching time per credit .

On the other hand the staff exchange program is also carried out within a period of approximately 2 weeks . It is also caused by many factors such as routine work at home university should not be left in a long time , and it is possible because it has not prepared a staff exchange in the formulation of long duration and melt into staff at the host institution for a specified period . It can be done and be prepared when going to become a model for improving the quality of staff concerned and really understand the system that can later be adapted and adjusted to the conditions in the home university in order to increase labor productivity ..

Lecturer exchange is one excellent model for complementarity of various things required from each university . **Current implementation of the MoU is focused between the sports center UM and Sport Science Faculty YSU , while other faculty who until now have not maximized the potential for and existence . If it is more institutionally maximized , it will be able to obtain the things that it is better to increase both parties .**

From the results of the implementation of the cooperation program , just one aspect to provide feedback to both parties . Evaluation of a student exchange cycle responses to pre-activity preparation stage or more than 19.1 % from 23.8 % over the well , and the implementation phase 58.4 % from 61.9 % over the well , and the final stage 12.3% from 14.3% over the well . Of the percentage obtained by describing the tendency that the program has been carried out between the two sides are having a positive impact . As affirmed by the participants in the open questionnaire answered that student exchange program is very necessary to continue with the periodic preparation and program materials that can be used to transfer credit . He said the program provides excellent benefits , among others, students feel the class to think internationally, opening up a more comprehensive insight . is an opportunity to encourage the spirit perform better .

In the institutional aspects, based on the obtained results that the study would still be centralistik cooperation in the field of sports studies course, not been made more comprehensive with various faculty, center or institute there. Up in this evaluation were found less maksimal link and match to empower other fields of study.



CONCLUSION

From the findings in this study concluded that the cooperation between UM - YSU and a macro has been implemented and meet the appropriate point-point MoU among others include education, research and publications, exchange of students, staff and faculty, but still only focused on college athletics while in college others yet to be maximized. Student exchange program is done in a relatively long range 3-6 months, so it can also be done as an equivalent credit transfer. Student responses indicate percentage yield greater of implementation programme in good and excellent categories.

ADVICE

From the findings in this study are somewhat advice such as:

1. Exchange students will be better when done in a relatively long range and can be done 3-6 months credit transfer.
2. Should be optimized with other college-appropriate faculty between the two Universityes.
3. Need to increase cooperation in research and publication aspects of international journals.

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
