GOLF

- Golf is a precision club and ball sport, in which competing players (or golfers use many types of clubs to hit balls into a series of holes on a golf course using the fewest number of strokes.
- A golf course consists of a series of holes, which generally consist of 9 or 18 holes.



Hazards

- Water hazards: rivers or lakes
- Bunkers/ sand traps: pits filled with sand
- Golf competition is generally played for the lowest number of strokes by an individual, known simply as stroke play. Players should get the ball into the hole with the strokes as few as possible.



Techniques in Golf

- Players should reduce the number of strokes.
 - By hitting the ball with the right distance
 - By hitting the ball with the right direction
 - By hitting the ball with risk
 - By hitting the ball in elevated, slopping, sideway, and bumpy surface
 - Bu hitting the ball with spin

Bowling

- Bowling is a sport in which the objective is to roll slightly asymmetric balls by using one hand.
- The bowling ball is rolled into ten pins arranged into a triangular row if it is seen from above.

Scoring System

- If all pins are struck in one bowl, it is called as strike
- If not all pins are struck in one bowl, one more chance is given to strike the rest.
- If there is no pin left in the second bowl, it is called as spare.
- If there are still pins after the second bowl, it is called as open frame.

Techniques in Bowling

- Bring down all pins in the first bowl.
- Roll the bowl into the right direction.
- Reach the target pins.
- Match with the track's condition.
- Bring down the pins left.
