KEY ISSUES IN TEACHING LISTENING

- n Listening as a social activity

 Tips on teaching learners to listen
 "socially"
 - 1. put the students in social situations
 - 2. teach active listening
 - 3. teach culturally appropriate listening
 - 4. since listening has a social dimension, it is useful to remember that different people react differently in social situations.



- n Use technology in the listening classroom
 - video
 - the internet
 - music
- n Self-study and learner autonomy
- n Extensive listening



- n Five things listening teachers need to remember
 - 1. link classroom tasks to real-life tasks
 - 2. provide a wide range of listening input
 - 3. teach listening strategies
 - 4. encourage learners to practice their listening skills out of class
 - 5. encourage learners to reflect on their learning
