PROBLEMS IN WRITING

WHAT WE NEED TO WRITE?

- Ability to generate ideas
- Vocabulary mastery
- Grammar sensitivity
- Ability to organize ideas
- Thinking systematically
- Putting ideas into paragraphs

WHAT TO BEGIN?

- Finding ideas to write
- Selecting a feasible idea
- Making a list of related vocabulary
- Making draft
- Developing drafts into paragraphs
- Checking grammatical errors
- Final editing

WHAT IS A GOOD PARAGRAPH?

- Having a topic
- Having a main idea concerning the topic (usually stated in a topic sentence)
- Having supporting details (definition, explanation, examples)
- Having coherence among sentences
- Having appropriate vocabulary and grammar accuracy

EXAMPLES

- Topic = Saving Endangered Animals
- Main idea = There are several crucial steps to save endangered animals
- Supporting detail =
 - what are endangered animals
 - examples of endangered animals
 - step 1 (explanation and examples)
 - step 2 (explanation and examples)
 - step 3 (explanation and examples)
- Closing statement
